15. Brief popular science project description, suitable for publication (max. 1,500 characters)

LARM is a humanities research infrastructure for radio and audio cultural heritage. The objective is to further radio and audio based research by securing a national bibliography for radio, maturing research source material with meta-data and annotations, developing tools for access, registering, indexing and dissemination. These resources will be integrated into a virtual environment for research—a researcher's digital radio archive and toolbox. The key term in this effort is 'user driven interoperability'. This suggests creating an IT-architecture for the research infrastructure, which supports both the integration of various resources, tools and formats into a common platform, and keeping the infrastructure extendable. This last feature will provide easy access for new clusters of research resources, tools and open a space for practice led research and self directed learning, thus also providing material for educational use. LARM is anchored in a consortium of humanities research and national cultural institutions committed to the cultural heritage—including its accessibility, maintenance and dissemination. Partners of the consortium are: The Danish Broadcast Corporation (DR), The Danish Research Network (DRN), The State and University Library (SB), Copenhagen University (KU), Roskilde University (RUC), The University of Aarhus (AU), Aalborg University (AAU), The University of Southern Denmark (SDU), The Royal School of Library and Information Science, and Denmark's Media Museum (DMM).

LARM er en humanistisk forskninginfrastruktur for kulturarvens radio- og lydmedier. Infrastrukturens mål er at fremme det voksende forskningsfelt for radio- og audiobaseret forskning og forskningsformidling gennem sikring af en digital national bibliografi for radio, gennem forskningsmodning af kildemateriale med metadata og annotationer og gennem udvikling af tilknyttede værktøjer til registering, indeksering og formidling. Nøgleordet er 'brugerdreven interoperabilitet'. Hertil skabes en IT-arkitektur for forskningsinfrastrukturen, som understøtter både en sømløs integration af forskellige datakilder, værktøjer og medieformater i en fælles platform og bevarer infrastrukturen åben for udvidelse. Sidstnævnte forhold vil tillade en enkel tilgang for nye materialesamlinger, værktøjer og åbne et rum for 'practice led research' og 'self directed learning', således at der også fra infrastrukturens ressourcer vil kunne udvikles formidlingsformater til uddannelser og eventuelt til et bredere publikum. LARM forankres i et konsortium af forsknings- og kulturinstitutioner, alle forpligtet på kulturarven – dens bevarelse, tilgængelighed og formidling. Konsortiet består af Danmarks Radio, Forskningsnettet, Statsbiblioteket, Københavns Universitet, Roskilde Universitet, Aarhus Universitet, Aalborg Universitet, Syddansk Universitet, Danmarks Biblioteksskole og Danmarks Mediemuseum.

Digitization of cultural heritage sources has high strategic priority for both the Danish Government and the EU. The Research Infrastructure LARM is in full continuation with these strategies and presents a unique opportunity and an outstanding solution for a vibrant part of the cultural heritage source material, rich in potential for emerging research and innovative dissemination.

LARM connects the research users to national archives of radio and data resources for research and research based knowledge dissemination. Access as well as interactive tools and functionalities will follow national and international standards and the LARM consortium will benefit from common and acknowledged copyright solutions.

LARM is committed to a user-driven approach: Researchers and research projects will contribute to the identification and description of materials, to development of interactive tools, of interaction designs for research dissemination and of wiki's and folksonomies, functionalities that will be accessible through a LARM web site.


LARM's vision is

- to secure research access to Danish radio resources through construction of a national infrastructure
- to mature radio and audio source material through the construction of a national bibliography of radio and the development of research specific tools
- to strengthen existing research milieus and to further the emerging research field of auditory culture
- to strengthen research dissemination within the field of radio and audio culture
- to contribute to international and international research in archive infrastructures.

LARM is anchored in a consortium committed to the cultural heritage--its accessibility, preservation and dissemination: The Danish Broadcast Corporation (DR), The Danish Research Network (FSK), The State and University Library (SB), Copenhagen University (KU), Roskilde University (RUC), The University of Aarhus (AU), Aalborg University (AAU), The University of Southern Denmark (SDU), The Royal School of Library and Information Science, and Denmark's Media Museum (DMM).

LARM operates through 6 main work packages. The overall timeframe comprises of seven phases, with milestones at 3, 9, 15, 21, 27, 33 and 36 months. In the first phase detailed work plans for the WPs will be developed. The overall basis for the technical infrastructure will be secured. Copyright solutions based on licensing are sought. Research environments are consolidated and expanded locally as well as nationally. A website for the LARM community is developed. Identification and digitisation of radio source material for development and testing of search and indexing tools are initiated. In the second phase the technical infrastructure will be developed further. Development will continue in the fourth, fifth and sixth phases. In addition tools for metadating are developed and tested, digitisation and metadating continue, wiki's and repositories are taking form and the development of formats for knowledge dissemination is started and evolved. The seventh phase marks the completion of the goals of the project. The functions and content of the infrastructure and the overall project will be evaluated.

LARM will be hosted at the University of Copenhagen in the project period. Overall responsibility lies with the **Members Board (MB)**, while responsibility for daily operation lies with the **Executive Board (EB)**.



The Members Board has a doubled chair, Main-Coordinator and Research Director. MB has one representative appointed by each partner. MB approves work plans and reports from EB and holds specific advisory tasks for EB. MB establishes user panels, sets up and approves collaborations with international partners, and encourages research groups and institutions to undertake derived research. MB is responsible for planning the operational phase following the funding period. The Executive Board is chaired by the same persons as MB, members are the heads of the 6 main work packages. EB members ensure collaboration between the individual work packages and associated cases— the overall objective being the achievement of maximum synergy. The Day-to-Day Project Manager (PM) monitors and facilitates operational tasks and reports to the chair of EB and MB. Financial management and support is handled by the key accountant for external financing at IKK, KU.

The amount applied for in total: **34.946.234 DKK**. The LARM consortium and its partners guaranties cofinancing to the amount of **9.467.727 DKK**. Total costs of the LARM research infrastructure for the construction period amount to **44. 403.970 DKK**

Radio Culture and Auditory Resources Infrastructure LARM Appendix 2, Project Proposal

The objective of the LARM-project is to construct a national, digital and user-driven research infrastructure, which will provide a nationally and internationally outstanding solution for preserving and maturing cultural heritage radio source material. This will enable and stimulate future radio and audio based research and knowledge dissemination in the Humanities, as well as interface with other national and international research- and archive infrastructures.

Radio and audio resources have national importance and constitute an entirely new and immensely rich field of research material, which will be of unmatched value to the Humanities. For instance, sound has grown in impact for innovation and creativity within design industries, urban planning and in everyday life, more so, it interacts with mobile media. Further, both international and national research in contemporary auditory culture grows in prominence, meaning that the cultural significance of auditory sources and history, primarily based on radio broadcast, is ripe for research.

However, historical radio and audio resources have generally been neglected as sources for common knowledge and research, either due to research traditions (humanities research is still skewed towards a reliance on print), copyright constraints or institutional practices. While visual media have diversified, but also experienced quantitative and qualitative increases and greater impact during the second half of the 20th Century, research into radio and audio culture has faded. This means that audio research has not developed coherently since its emergence in the mid-thirties. There is, for example, no detailed research within the Humanities, which covers this part of the cultural heritage, just as there is very limited research (in e.g. history, rhetoric and linguistics), which uses historical, auditory material as a source. In this respect the source material must be matured for research.

This is also in line with the strong national interests in digitizing and preserving cultural heritage. Hence, the gap between the impact of sound in contemporary culture and the history of sound may be bridged by a research infrastructure that is committed to and aimed, not only at preserving these historic sources, but also at maturing them for new knowledge and new research paradigms.

The LARM infrastructure will be directed at cultural heritage sources for radio in particular. This part of the cultural heritage is found in the archives of the Danish Broadcast Corporation (DR), in State Media Collection based at the State and University Library (SB) as well as in local archives - mainly museums such as The Danish Media Museum (DMM). The existent analogue and digitized collections of radio resource material at DR represents a unique, collected, cultural history from one of the oldest broadcasting services in the world. The collections are not only comparable to other international broadcasting corporations, but unique among these in the coverage of cultural and political history.

The research infrastructure will encourage and support the use of radio resource materials in such fields as linguistics, media studies, ethnology and auditory culture. It will enable basic and applied research in areas such as:

- The aesthetics of radio
- The reception of radio
- The everyday culture of radio
- The radio as a nation- and identity building medium
- Public broadcast institutions
- Radio and popular culture
- The validity of radio as source to the political history
- Radio and technology

Besides the maturation of the research infrastructure for radio and audio resources, the LARM-project will result in new and advanced user-driven research solutions associated with the infrastructure such as:

- Tools and standards for meta-dating and annotation of radio and other audio material
- Implementation of web 2.0 social solutions (wikis, folksonomies) for the development of coherent terminologies and taxonomies for sound, audio media, formats and genres
- Federated searching and interactive search tools
- Tools for resource and knowledge exchange
- Interoperability between national research infrastructures through national and international standards

The development of national infrastructure for research on radio and audio material will be based upon the existing Danish Research Network, FSK (www.fsknet.dk). In this way, the consortium will benefit from acknowledged copyright solutions. In addition, the infrastructure will connect researchers to the national archives of radio and data resources to be used in research and knowledge dissemination.

Please note that the virtual infrastructure of LARM includes the technical infrastructure, copyright agreements, the construction of a digital national bibliography of radio programmes, repositories and additional web 2.0 developed terminologies and taxonomies.

Mission and vision

The *mission* of the LARM-project is to develop and construct a national, digital and user-driven research infrastructure that will contribute to the preservation and use of the cultural heritage of Danish radio and audio resources. Digitization of the Danish cultural heritage has become a national issue with a high priority with regard to access and dissemination. This is supported by the Media agreement for 2007-10 from the Danish Government and the recent Cultural Heritage

Report¹ published by the Ministry of Cultural Affairs. Digitization of radio resources and accessibility through national research infrastructures such as LARM represent a possibility to develop a significant part of this heritage and to mature it for new generations of knowledge producers. The very possibility of listening to radio sources will trigger insights and new research practices, but also further exiting forms of research and knowledge dissemination.

By establishing a national research infrastructure of audio material, the *vision* of the LARM-project is to contribute to stronger and more coherent European efforts in the field. This is in line the report on research infrastructures of 2006: *The European Strategy Forum for Research Infrastructure* (ESFRI), which states that: "Digitizing the products of human culture and society poses intrinsic problems of complexity and scale. [...]Today, *the social sciences and humanities are however hampered by the fragmentation of the scientific information space.* Data, information and knowledge are scattered in space and divided by language, cultural, economic, legal and institutional barriers." Digitisation of cultural heritage sources is a task that in scope, complexity and media variation requires a coordinated effort - nationally as well as internationally - to become coherent. In turn, this will increase research intensity and improve research quality as well as the possibility of performing comparative studies between Denmark and other countries on the development of auditory history and culture.

To sum up, the mission and vision of the infrastructure are:

- to ensure research access to Danish radio and cultural heritage resources through the construction of a technical and national infrastructure in correspondence with legal agreements
- to mature radio and audio source material through the construction of a digital national bibliography of Danish radio and the development of research specific tools and solutions for research
- to strengthen existing research milieus and to further the growing research field of auditory culture
- to strengthen research dissemination within the field of radio
- to contribute methodologies and tools for the benefit of other users and materials in the future
- to enable and contribute to the international research and archive infrastructures

Collaboration

LARM is anchored in a consortium of leading research and cultural institutions, all bound to cultural heritage – including its maintenance, accessibility and dissemination. The consortium consists of The University of Copenhagen (KU), Roskilde University (RUC), The University of Aarhus (UA), Aalborg University (AAU), University of Southern Denmark (SDU), The Royal School of Library and Information Science (DB), The Danish Broadcasting Cooperation (DR), The State and University Library (SB), The Danish Research Net (FSK) and Denmark's Media Museum (DMM). The organisational framework for the LARM research infrastructure is described in the Appendix 3.

The 2006 establishment of a pilot project research collection of copy tapes from DR-ARC at KU for research use (Mini-LARM) will present a heuristic guide for the future collaboration between archives and institutions. The Members' Board of the Mini-LARM archive have representatives from KU, RUC and DR, which have served a wide range of researchers and students at KU and RUC. Interdisciplinary seminars and cooperation within the framework of mini-LARM and the archive's geographical proximity to the research milieus of KU have intensified the research environment for radio and auditory culture at The Faculty of Humanities (KU). In addition, this has engendered a vibrant milieu of young researchers (PhDs, Post.doc's and Research Assistants). First level recruitment is made possible through self-directed learning performed by graduate students in collaboration between KU and DR, which supplements a number of courses in radio- and sound dissemination formats at the universities.

The present LARM-consortium will collaborate on specific sub-projects (work-packages) in the overall LARM-project. Methods, results and tools developed in research environments during the project period will be made accessible in a digital repository and toolbox for the benefit of all partners, hence the polytechnic character of the consortium will be strengthened – one of the key success parameters of the project.


Milestones

The overall timeframe comprises seven phases, with milestones at 3, 9, 15, 21, 27, 33 and 36 months. The timeframe for the individual WP's may deviate from the main milestones of the project (the individual milestones are outlined below). To ensure the best possible exchange between technical development, research needs and research methodological solutions, each milestone will be documented through reports to the infrastructure Members Board.

In the first phase, detailed work plans for the WPs will be developed. The overall basis for the technical infrastructure will be secured. Copyright solutions based on licensing are sought. Existent research environments are consolidated and expanded locally as well as nationally. A website for the LARM community is developed. Identification and digitisation of radio source material for use in the development and testing of search and indexing tools will be initiated. Studies on demand are performed.

In the second phase the technical infrastructure will be developed further. Development will continue in the fourth, fifth and sixth phases. In addition, tools for meta-dating are developed and tested, digitisation and meta-dating will continue, wiki's and repositories take form and the development of formats for knowledge dissemination will be initiated and evolved. The seventh phase marks the completion of the project goals. The functions and content of the infrastructure and the overall project will be valuated. See flow chart below.

Work packages

The sub-projects of the infrastructure mission are divided into 6 main work-packages (WPs), 5 of which are sub-divided into a number of smaller work packages. The overall structure of the project is illustrated by the WP-diagram below

WP1 is dedicated to overall coordination and management. The day-to-day project manager will ensure communication within the project (Main-Coordinator and Research Director, The Members Board and Executive Board) but also between the infrastructure project and the Ministry of Research. The Project Manager and the Executive Board will ensure that all WPs follow milestone plans for delivery. In collaboration with the WP-leaders, the coordinator will set up Quality Assurance measures for all deliverances and make sure that the project runs smoothly.

The **Copyright issues** are the main focus of **WP 1.2**. Clearing of copyright is essential to the project. The main parts of the materials to be used are from the 20th century and will therefore be copyright protected. Being responsible for the State Media Archive, the State and University Library (SB) has experience in negotiating agreements with the copyright holders in providing access to audiovisual materials, especially for research, teaching, and study purposes in further and higher education. Clearing of copyright in the LARM project will represent a new development based on online loans, but be in continuation of SB's existing agreement with the collecting society Copydan. Further, a recent revision (June 2008) of the Danish Copyright Act will make it possible to negotiate extended collective license agreements. The intention is to negotiate a business model which - as far as possible - will be scalable, so that it can include other materials in the infrastructure, also after the project period.

WP2 is responsible for the technical infrastructure of the LARM project. The focus within the project will be audio material and the chosen case studies of LARM. The infrastructure will be designed with special attention to the researchers and students at the institutions participating in the project. The infrastructure will provide access to the relevant parts of SB's archive, where the materials from DR will be made available. It will develop and provide a dynamic access platform, Cultural Heritage Archives Open System (CHAOS), which will support all the basic functions needed by the users. CHAOS will be built on the existing Edumedia platform: www.edumedia.dk, developed by the FSK, SB and DR, the participants in WP2




Fig 2. The infrastructure and development work in WP2

Each of the 3 participants in WP2 will appoint a team member as coordinator. The coordinators form a project management group for WP2, WP2.0, that maintain a project plan within the iterative framework. The group is

responsible for communication and interaction with the remaining LARM work packages, assuring a flexible and reliable IT-delivery supporting the entire project.

WP2.1 is responsible for transforming the digital content from the archives to the CHAOS platform. This will be metadata as well as the media files in transcoded form to the formats legally allowed and as needed by the users. The transfer may be upfront, batch occasionally or dynamic on the fly dependent on capacity of the system and response time considerations.

WP2.2 is responsible for the architecture and establishment of the basic system for CHAOS with servers, storage, system software and database systems. Here experiences of SB's current Digital Object Management System (DOMS) will be taken into account. This system is built around the Open Source repository software Fedora Commons http://www.fedora-commons.org, which is used in several similar projects around the world. The hosting of the system is under the responsibility of SB as the institution that by Danish law is allowed to provide the cultural heritage content to the media research community. This may imply some synergy and cost saving, especially in the storage area, as SBs archive already has a large capacity in the Petabyte range. In addition to the basic functions of the platform made available in WP2.2, a number of special functions are required and delivered by WP 2.3. Up front, the following have been identified: *Identity and Access Management* (WAYF, www.wayf.dk, will be used but some special support for walkin users - e.g. IP-number validation - is required), an advanced search system to the entire pool of content, standard access functions such as players, streaming and download. Also, tools that collect user generated data are part of the plan, thus offering the possibility of supporting web 2.0 social technology, collecting information into user created folksonomies. Access management and search system are released early in the project. Special tools are made available in steps according to project plan.

A simple website is provided by WP2.4 as the obvious mechanism for providing access to the content of the search system, while identity and access management is provided by WP2.3. This will be available early on in the project. New business and architectural concepts have emerged during the last few years. Among these is the concept of Software as a Service (SaaS), where applications are not installed on the local computer, but made available by internet access to a network-based service. A well-known example of SaaS is Google Apps. With SaaS, the security for protected content can be enforced better as all programs applied are provided by the central environment. Other advantages include better possibilities for collaboration between groups working with the same material. Further releases of the website will include ever more SaaS based services.

WP2.5 will analyse and maintain a list of recommended applications that are already in use or can be acquired and used locally by the researchers and institutions that take part in the project. Where possible, Open Source or shareware programs will be included in the list, made available early on in the project. In addition many of the functions provided by the CHAOS solution will be offered as SOAP XML-webservices. This will allow local IT-literate sites to integrate the unctions of CHAOS conveniently into the local infrastructure.

Operation and support are the main tasks of WP 2.6. The production platform will be the responsibility of SB. Support will be provided through SB's helpdesk. The service will be extended with new or updated elements as the

development process advances. A testing and quality assurance process will be applied before new releases roll out and, in accordance with the standard DS484 security procedures, which are already in place at SB.

The only way for media researchers to navigate large amounts of digitized radio programmes is to have an index with proper metadata. Such an index is in effect a national bibliography for radio programmes containing information on every programme broadcasted in Denmark since the start of Statsradiofonien (The National Radio, later DR) in 1925. The purpose of WP3 is to establish the data for such a database by collecting and integrating basic information at programme level. The purpose of this project is to collect data regarding radio programmes from DR, incl. the nine regional DR channels. The database will be prepared to contain the same kind of data from other radio stations and TV programmes. The information needed does exist, but mainly in print, wherefore digitization will be complicated. The database is expected to be available for users in the fourth phase of the project.

During the construction of the LARM infrastructure, exchange and updating of knowledge must be formalised. The Think Tanks of the **WP4** are inter-disciplinary settings for discussing new perspectives, development of methods and tools or contextualisation of common issues in the LARM project. They are intended to have an international scope - one possibility is to invite leading researchers or specialist within the field of digital archives and infrastructures. Another is to partake in research travels outside Denmark. As part of knowledge sharing, each of the think tanks will be obliged to arrange a seminar on a central topic for the LARM community.

WP5 consists of one general WP and eleven specific WPs, all developed in order to qualify as well as challenge the technical infrastructure. Researchers from a broad variety of research fields in the humanities will deliver user-driven and qualified tools and research results that will contribute to the development and maturation of the research infrastructure. Each of the WPs also represents (a) specific research perspective(s) or focuses on a specific aspect of radio and audio material. Each WP5 focuses upon clusters of radio sources from different periods of radio history, stored in different formats, thereby drawing attention to the diversity and richness of the cultural heritage pertaining to radio. One point of uncertainty in describing auditory culture is the development of a common, conceptual apparatus or a philology applicable to various disciplines. Such a philology may on a smaller scale, be developed on the basis of the work on describing conducted by the WP5's

WP 5.0 is a general work-package with primarily an information science perspective. WP 5.0 seeks to analyse and identify general needs and information seeking behaviour among humanistic researchers in order to gain access to and benefit from the cultural heritage of radio and audio material. A central research question is: What requirements to metadata will the result of the initial analysis imply, what metadata exists already, and what additional metadata is needed, how should a tool for meta-dating (professional and user-generated) and searching be designed to serve and adapt to specific research needs and behaviours? The development of metadata and search facilities in relation to radio and audio material is a prerequisite for the specific cases in WP 5. In this way WP 5.0 bridges the technical layer (WP 2), the white programmes (WP 3) and the research cases from the humanities (WP 5).

The information science research perspective is continued in WP 5.1 by focusing upon selected researchers and research domains, their specific needs and search behaviour. In addition, WP 5.1 seeks to investigate in which way the

information architecture and interaction design may qualify and add value to the specific researchers' access to and use of the digitized radio and audio cultural heritage in research. Test collections with specific semantic tools will be developed and evaluated with the above research interests in mind. The test collection will be based on one of the largest collections in DR, the DAT-tape-collection (radio broadcasts: 1989-2005), which will be digitized along the project period

The aim of the **WP 5.2** is to register the language forms represented in the programmes of DR, especially the language forms of the anchors in news programmes – the most authoritative programmes in radio³. Radio has very seldom been used as a source in the field of sociolinguistics. The study of historical changes in language forms in public service radio will, however, be a useful tool for future comparative analyses of standardisation processes in the Danish language. As part of the analysis, the oral language used on the radio is transferred to a well-tested transcript format adapted to the standardisation norms of the European Humanities research infrastructure CLARIN. This transcript format can easily be implemented into other research fields.

Programmes produced in the children's and youth department in DR (the B&U), 1967-1999, mark a unique, politically engaged documentation of adolescent and youth cultures. Access will bring new insights to the researchers in this field. In WP 5.3, clusters of the B&U material (programmes from 1974, 1984, 1994) will be located and made accessible through qualitative analyses from a media- and culture-historical perspective. The analyses will focus on the technical aspects as well the content of the radiophonic material and contribute to the media philological vocabulary for the description of auditory material. The history of B&U will be introduced to a broader public through exhibitions at the DMM, mainly directed at school children. Based on these exhibitions, didactic use of sound and web 2.0 social tools in the exhibition space will be explored and described, thereby contributing to both the mapping of user behaviour and the best practices development of dissemination formats within the infrastructure project.

WP 5.4 aims at innovation in the intersection between technology and research in the humanities. It focuses on the hidden or unheard sections of the sound archives of DR, SB, ZKM (Karlsruhe) and smaller national and international archives from an epistemological, aesthetic and archive oriented perspective. The aim is first to locate and draw attention to unknown avant-garde material in the archives of DR and other archives. This process will point to the importance of other sources of information regarding the content of the archives, such as the requisition reports found at DR. Second, the material will be introduced to international researchers as well as to the broader public through exhibitions, special platforms and information spaces using pervasive design and tangible interfaces.

In WP 5.5 focus is upon the formative as well as the informative role of the Danish public service radio in a periodwhere radio was the dominant electronic medium (1925 to 1960). The mission is to locate how radio talks and educational programmes for schools (Skoleradio) has influenced the building of national identity⁴ from the perspective of Cultural analyses and, furthermore, how this influence has changed over time due to changes in the conception of public

service etc. The case draws attention to hitherto unheeded materials in the archives, which will be digitised, mapped for future analysis.

Central to the WP5.6 are two aesthetic genres: literature and drama, as they are presented in the radio. The aim is firstly to describe the performative and didactic qualities of the voice and to locate the use of the voice as influenced by the technologies of radio - variations in language norms and changing ideas. Secondly, the case focuses on the impact of the voice in the presentation of literature and drama. The analyses draw on research perspectives such as performance theory, literature didactics and cognitive analysis. Research from the humanities and technical approaches are combined in the development and use of an interactive tool for measurement and comparison of voices (frequency, volume etc.).

The WP5.7 is concerned with radio for new platforms, such as DAB and internet (http://www.dr.dk/radio/). Research questions are: How do users adapt to new ways of thinking and producing radio? What is the relationship between technologies and the social use of radio? The study is threefold: 1) analysis of the policy oriented and strategic dispositions in DR in order to locate the types of programmes and flows that stimulate user interaction and to the establishment of user communities; 2) analyses of chosen analogue programmes with integrated internet dimension or supplement from other net services; 3) user analyses. The project combines social science and approaches from the humanities and is the first of its kind nationally.

The WP5.8 is dedicated to the analysis of syntax on the radio. Syntax is used metaphorically to denote the unwritten rules for the combination of sounds used to establish meaning and coherence in radio productions. The focus is upon rhythm (the distribution of radio in time) and space (the delay of time flow). Aims are: Re-actualisation and contextualisation of historic radio material and jingles, contributions to the philology of radio and, finally, the study of the technological history of DR, based on interviews with former and present staff members – an invaluable source to the production history of the DR.

The above mentioned WP 5's will be running through out the project period. Due to its reliance on quantitative data and statistical analysis which is not available before the launch of the national radio bibliography, **WP 5.9** is expected to start up in the third phase of the period. WP 5.9 lies in continuation of two projects funded by the FKK,⁵ which focus upon pop music in the national broadcast radio, 1950-57. The mission is firstly to quantify the amount of pop music broadcast in the period (genres, flows, strategies) and, further, to register and analyse how the music was presented. The analysis combines cultural historical and music research perspectives.

In order to allow new perspectives on the cultural heritage of radio to unfold **WP5.10** is thought as an open case. A call for project proposals will be announced in the fourth phase of the project period.

Dissemination and recruitment is central tasks in WP6. A LARM website as well as a project database for the LARM community will be managed in WP 6.1. The website provides access to user-generated taxonomies, wikipedias and folksonomies as well as to the open source repository for dissertation formats, syllabuses, reports, papers, formats and MA dissertations, etc. Website, functionalities and project-database will be made accessible for researchers and students

nationally and internationally. The significant interest in the dissemination of the cultural heritage of radio shown in the WP5's is mirrored in WP6.2, which is dedicated to the research based development of dissemination formats for auditory culture, for instance sound based formats for mobile media. WP 6.3 serves as a nesting box for graduate students representing the first level recruitment in the emergent field of radio and audio based research.

Quality, topicality and relevance of the project

The LARM infrastructure will create a unique national solution to a much needed access to coherent radio and audio resources and collections, also providing tools for research, and will secure preconditions for research in Danish radio and audio culture through collaboration between the strongest partners possible (Appendix 4). Close interaction between research and cultural heritage institutions and FSK will secure technological, legal and indexing standards, and future solutions to research access challenges such as persistent linking and geo centres. The emergent field of radio and auditory culture (as indicated by WP5 and subdivisions) will benefit immensely from LARM and plans for an Auditory Culture Centre anchored at IKK, KU, will develop. Likewise research in digital archives, new media and dissemination, a priority of the humanities, will be boosted.

The infrastructure as well as the research supported by the infrastructure is aimed at collaborating with international institutions, already initiated through research networks such as DRACE (Digital Radio Cultures in Europe), IAMCR (International Association for Media and Communication Research) and ICOM (International Council of Museums). Connections to European infrastructures will be initiated and strengthened: The Humanities Infrastructures, DARIAH and CLARIN both have partnerships at the Faculty of Humanities, KU, where LARM will be anchored. LARM partner SB is partner of EUROPEANA, central to the cultural institutions of Europe. An infrastructure comparable to LARM, in terms of cross-institutional partnerships, is the German Netzwerk Mediatheken collaborating with ZKM (Zentrum für Kunst und Medientechnologie, Karlsruhe), associated to LARM (WP5.4)5.4

Only through national infrastructures as LARM will Danish researchers receive the necessary support for knowledge advancement, as digitization and accessibility to source material boosts all fields. Digital infrastructures are of the greatest importance to the ambitious aims of the Humanities in the field of cultural heritage and will enhance European and other international research collaborations.

Radio Culture and Auditory Resources Research Infrastructure *LARM* Appendix 3, Consortium and Organisation

1. Consortium

The Research Infrastructure LARM will be developed and operated by a consortium of leading Danish humanities research institutions, major cultural institutions with archival and dissemination responsibilities and the National Research Network (DRN). The objective is to develop and construct a national, digital and legal research infrastructure that will enable and stimulate future audio and radio based research as well as knowledge dissemination.

The following *research institutions* are partners in the consortium: The Royal School of Library and Information Science, Copenhagen & Aalborg, (Dept. of Information Interaction and Information Architecture), University of Aarhus (Dept. of Information and Media Studies, Centre for Internet Research), University of Copenhagen (KU), (Dept. of Arts and Cultural Studies, IKK), Roskilde University (RUC) (Dept. of Culture and Identity, CUID), Aalborg University Copenhagen (CIT) (Centre for Digital, Interactive Media, InDiMedia), University of Southern Denmark (SDU) (Institute of Literature, Media and Culture) and Denmark's Media Museum, Odense (DMM) in collaboration with SDU.


The following *cultural institutions* with archival and dissemination responsibilities as well as technical engagement are: The State and University Library (SB), the Danish Research Network (FSK) and the Danish Broadcasting Corporation (DR). They will jointly develop and operate the technological infrastructure necessary to provide access to digitised content from the national cultural heritage archives. This new infrastructure will be built on the existing educational media platform, Edumedia, developed by the same three institutions. FSK deliver a high speed fibre optic network infrastructure, DR and the Section for Cultural Heritage supplies source material for LARM from digital and analogue collections in DR's archive, subcontractor to the DR Section for Cultural Heritage. Archivists from DR will facilitate researchers during the project period. Digital source material in streamed versions from DR's archive will be available for research through SB. SB hold considerable collections of archival radio programmes and will be housing the LARM audio repository facilities.

The research institutions represent a broad variety of research fields within the humanities. Scholars from six humanities research institutions, operating through 10 exemplary case studies, will provide basic research that will enable future research based on radio source material. A primary goal is to define the needs for and develop metadata, philologies and search tools regarding radio and audio material as well disseminate radio research through the LARM infrastructure. The consortium is also connected to international archive and infrastructure projects such as Europeana through its partners. In this way, the LARM consortium represents the best and most comprehensive technical, archival and scholarly expertise in key areas of radio and auditory research, necessary to construct the infrastructure and populate it with data.

2. Management: technical, scientific and administrative organisation

Initiated by IKK (KU) LARM will be placed at the University of Copenhagen in the project period.

Workflow and milestones are organized in 6 dedicated main work packages. The overall responsibility lies with the **Members Board (MB)**, while the responsibility for daily operational matters lies with the **Executive Board (EB)**.



The Members Board has a doubled chair, Head of IKK (KU), Ass. Prof. M. Huang (Main-Coordinator), and Head of CUID (RUC), Prof. Ib Poulsen (Research Director). In addition, MB has one representative appointed by each partner. MB approves work plans and reports from EB and holds specific advisory tasks for EB. MB establishes user panels, sets up and approves collaborations with international partners, and encourages research groups and institutions to undertake derived research. MB is responsible for planning the operational phase following the funding period. Administration of the infrastructure includes operational activities, such as purchase of legal expertise, driving and supporting a network of future infrastructure users (a professional forum for humanities researchers), encouraging humanities research and cultural environments to initiate derived research, and coordinate activities at an international level.

The **Executive Board** is chaired by the same two persons chairing MB, and its members are the heads of the 6 main work packages. EB members ensure collaboration between the individual work packages and associated cases to ensure that tools and methods are re-used, common standards adhered to, common solutions found to similar problems — the overall objective being the achievement of maximum synergy. The Day-to-Day Project Manager (PM) is

responsible for the day-to-day management of activities and administration. PM monitors and facilitates operational tasks: communication; work plans; time schedules; deliverables, targets and milestones, implementation of quality assurance, handling of copyright issues, and reports to the chair of EB and MB. Financial management and support is handled by the key accountant for external financing at IKK, KU.

3. Investment profile for preparation, construction and operation

Extensive investments have been made in national and international plans for digitizing cultural heritage resources: The Danish Ministry of Culture has proposed 300 mill DKK, alternatively 570 mill DKK for the digitisation of the cultural heritage during the next 10 years. Due to the Media Agreement DR is obliged to digitize its archives for a certain amount of its income. Major cultural institutions as DR and SB have developed local infrastructures, fitting for digitization and indexing of audio-visual data in a variety of media formats. The research need for an infrastructure has now matured in that various research groups, projects and networks have been formed and funded, study programmes have been developed and collaborations between cultural institutions have grown in capacity and quality. Further, with the procurement of the new fibre optic network infrastructure of FSK, funded by the Danish Agency for Science, Technology and Innovation, an overall framework for a network-based national research infrastructures in general, and a national infrastructure for humanities research users of radio and audio resources, in particular, can be constructed. All of the above mentioned activities can be seen as **preparations** for a user driven national research infrastructure within the area of radio and auditory culture research. Hence, this proposal for a national research infrastructure builds on already existing resources and on extensive experience in platform and tool development, as well as in data identification, collection, indexing and digitization; assets which have been financed by the partners themselves.

A central financing task for MB will be to clarify questions and solutions within the field of *copyright*. These are handled by the Danish representative in the EBLIDA expert Group on Copyright Issues and head of Research, SB, Harald von Hielmcrone. The consortium has a budget of 360.000 DKK for copyright-licenses in the funding period and gives access to developed tools during and after the funding period. Another major financial issue is the digitisation of the 'white programmes' to form a national bibliography on radio, in sum 5.7 mill DKK within the first year of the project.

Initial investments for upgrading the technical infrastructure amount to 5.05 mill DKK. Continued operation and development of the proposed technical infrastructure amounts to a minimum of 1.8 mill DKK per year. Individual WP5's and WP 6's are each provided with a budget for support, technical supply and further upgrading of the technical infrastructure (in sum 5.6 mill DKK). WP5s and WP6s are each held responsible for their individual budgets (in sum 21 mill DKK). Co-financing of operational costs in the funding period are shared by the consortium with an average of 20% of the sum total.

Future visions, funding and user-access

After the FI funding period the consortium will organize itself in a centre to continue and broaden its collaboration. The aim is to ensure a continued development of the national infrastructure as well as future participation and engagement in

international research infrastructures and archival development. In future the virtual infrastructure will be anchored at FSK (development, general search and indexing tools), SB (metadata and digital source material) and KU (providing the platform for virtual research communities, research dissemination, development of research tools and dissemination formats). The future vision for the LARM-project is to continue the development of the virtual infrastructure, but to gradually include more research perspectives on radio and auditory culture as well as research in other media formats. The existence and continued development of a national research infrastructure for radio and audio resources will also have beneficial effects for the educational system and for other cultural institution. This includes other user profiles apart from researchers, taking into consideration the future use of the infrastructure due to which several other user scenarios can be foreseen, which should be encouraged and supported.

Radio Culture and Auditory Resources Research Infrastructure LARM

Appendix 4, Institutional Strategies

Access to digitized cultural heritage sources has high strategic priority, for both the Danish Government and the EU. LARM is in continuation with this, as its objective is to mature radio culture heritage resources for research, and research infrastructure suggested presents a unique opportunity and an outstanding solution for a vibrant part of the cultural heritage, rich in potential for emerging research and innovative dissemination.

The EU has launched several major infrastructure and archive projects, among the most prominent are:

- 1) **Europeana** (European digital library, museum and archive) committed to provide access to cultural and scientific heritage in the scale of 2 mill digital objects. The Danish Agency for Libraries and Media, The RUNAS and The State and University Library (SB, partner of LARM) are national partners of Europeana.
- 2) ESFRI's acceptance (2006) of DARIAH (Digital Research Infrastructure for The Arts and Humanities) and CLARIN (Common Language Resources and Technology) as Humanities infrastructures for the European Roadmap for Research Infrastructures. Both Danish Clarin and the Danish DARIAH partnership are anchored at the Faculty of Humanities, KU, where also LARM will be anchored.

Nationally

3) the Danish Report on Digitization of the Cultural Heritage (2009) states that access to digitized cultural heritage resources will further Humanities research and education. Digitization is seen (p.36) as prerequisite to internationalising Danish front research, to inter-disciplinary research and to attracting international research funding, objectives highlighted in all university strategies.

Auditory culture expands internationally, in both basic and applied research, and strong Danish milieus have emerged during the past years. Access to digitized audio source material and valid meta-data, though, is scarce, and audio resources are to a lesser extent than print and visual resources prioritized in the national digitization strategy. To secure this emergent field with high research potentiality, the LARM consortium will create an infrastructure providing access to coherent radio and audio resource collections and developing tools for research and dissemination. The close interaction between 6 research and 2 cultural heritage institutions and the Danish Research Network (FSK) guarantees an integrated, interoperable and extendable infrastructure build on common standards, high quality of research maturation and stable and persistent accessibility.

Each partner of LARM has a particular objective, guided by the overall aim of the project and benefiting maximum project synergy (App. 2). The objectives of the partners build on long term expertise and strategic research development. These commitments are acknowledged by each partner institution, being in continuation with local strategies.

Department of Arts and Cultural Studies (IKK, KU: http://kunstogkulturvidenskab.ku.dk) prioritizes interdisciplinary and collaborative, practice led research, considered basic to advancement of international research collaborations. Auditory culture research at IKK is a key example of this, with core development of new media production formats for research dissemination and first level student recruitment. IKK hosts the national Auditory Culture Research Network (Danish Research Agency) and The Mini-LARM collection (App. 2), used increasingly for basic research and dissemination, in collaboration with prominent radio producers. The LARM infrastructure will further emergent radio- and auditory research, learning and dissemination at IKK, also through WP 6's community and recruitment aspects.

Department of Culture and Identity (CUID, RUC: www.ruc.dk/cuid) is strong in Danish radio history research, due to Prof. Ib Poulsen's prominent research. A strategic aim is the strengthening of media research with a "focus on the analysis of content and form as well as on aspects of media reception. The analytical approach also includes the media's cultural and historical context (...)". Prerequisite to this is access to media resources such as DR radio programs that will open further analysis, in which aspects of form and content are deployed in a wider cultural and historical context. This context is, however, for a substantial part in itself mediated, and LARM will provide a significant increase of this particular disseminated context as well.

Centre for Internet Research (IMV, AU: www.cfi.au.dk) conducts front research into the social and cultural functions and implications of the Internet. Two research projects, funded by the Danish Research Agency, are anchored at the centre: "The History of DR's Website" and "Changing Borderlines: Mediatization and Cultural citizenship". LARM will offer a broadened access to digitized resources and tools in continuation with ongoing research at the centre and front research at the centre will contribute prominently to the infrastructure's construction and to develop new research fields to be included in the infrastructure.

Centre for interactive Media (InDiMedia, AAU: www.indimedia.dk) conducts research into and development of interactive communication and new interactive media. The InDiMedia Knowledge Group of Art and Digital Technology (ArDT) focuses on art's interaction with digital technologies and works in a practice led learning environment, in which artistic training and technological competence is related to theories on art, technology and culture. In continuation with ArDT's strategy, LARM will help locate archival examples of sound art and technologies interacting. An ArDt design (with Kolding School of Design) for research dissemination will contribute to the LARM infrastructure.

Institute of Literature, Media and Cultural Studies (SDU: www.sdu.dk/om_sdu/institutter_centre) hosts DREAM (Danish Research Centre on Education and Advanced Media Materials, funded by KINO) that conducts research into digital communication in the educational sector. In the institute's cultural studies section youth culture is a prime research area. LARM will provide source material for a unique project in DR's children's and youth radio. The children's and youth's radio research connects to Denmark's Media Museum (DMM: www.mediemuseum.dk), where children's radio programs from the 1960's Radio Mercur are kept, and in continuation with a strong expertise in new educational practice, a strategic aim is to establish a teaching milieu with auditory resources. DMM partakes in the research project

Learing 2.0 (DREAM) on digital dissemination of media history to young people, and LARM will strengthen the museum's dissemination of youth radio, enabling the provision and development of tools connecting research and public, taxonomy and folksonomy.

The Royal School of Library and Information Science (DB: www.db.dk) generates new knowledge and competencies that help satisfy the information, learning and experience needs of society. Little is known about how audio-material from digital archives is accessed, searched and used and more insight is needed into the ways of organizing and tagging audio material. In constructing the LARM Infrastructure, the research program Information Architecture and Information Interaction at DB has expertise and front knowledge within user and information behavior, the development and employment of metadata and semantic tools as well as evaluation. The focus is on the interaction between information seeking/retrieval, knowledge systems, information and users. This expertise will be further strengthened through the LARM-project.

As a national library The State and University Library (SB: www.statsbiblioteket.dk) collects and provides access to the cultural heritage as well as preserves cultural resources for the future. SB houses the National Media Collection where Danish radio and TV broadcasts is collected, preserved and made accessible to research and educational use. SB has extensive experience in negotiating copyright agreements, also concerning online delivery of audiovisual material. This expertise will be prerequisite to LARM. To meet the obligations of preserving cultural resources SB has built an elaborate, digital storage infrastructure. Trusted repository and systems for dissemination of digitized collections have been constructed, according to international standards. Finally, digital long time preservation is a specific area of priority. It is a strategic objective for SB to support a national e-science infrastructure for Danish universities, allowing simultaneously storage and preservation of scientific data.

The Danish Research Network-participation in LARM is fully in terms with the mission of FSK (www.forskningsnettet.dk), which is to supply Danish research milieus with networks and infrastructure services. The LARM partnership interacts with already initiated activities, such as Edumedia and the WAYF-project. Furthermore, FSK collaborates with DR and SB on providing access to the Danish cultural heritage. This collaboration is the offspring of the engagement in the LARM infrastructure-project.

The Danish Broadcast Corporations's (DR: www.dr.dk) research strategy is to provide national research access for digitized audio-visual resources in collaboration with FSK and SB, thus securing user authorization. DR houses a variety of radio resources, part of which will be digitized, starting with the DAT-tapes in 2009. The LARM infrastructure is very well in continuation with the strategies of DR and will qualify and further the use of digitized resources by user-driven features and by providing tools for meta-dating and also system evaluation.
